God created the fish of the sea, the birds of the air, the wild beasts of the field, and the cattle. He saw that they were all good. It was part of God's plan and purpose to create these animals. Genesis 1:21 says, "And God created great whales, and every living creature that moveth, which the waters brought forth abundantly, after their kind, and every winged fowl after his kind: and God saw that it was good."

Genesis 1:24-26 says, "And God said, Let the earth bring forth the living creature after his kind, cattle, and creeping thing, and beast of the earth after his kind: and it was so. And God made the beast of the earth after his kind, and cattle after their kind, and every thing that creepeth upon the earth after his kind: and God saw that it was good. And God said, Let us make

Psalm 8:6-9 says, "Thou madest him to have dominion over the works of thy hands; thou hast put all things under his feet: all sheep and oxen, yea, and the beasts of the field; The fowl of the air, and the fish of the sea, and whatsoever passeth through the paths of the seas. O LORD our Lord, how excellent is thy name in all the earth!"

To tame means to make it less powerful and easier to control. Many animals today have been tamed by human beings. There are animals that will actually go up to human beings without hurting them because they have been tamed by the humans. James 3:7 says, "For every kind of beasts, and of birds, and of serpents, and of things in the sea, is tamed, and hath been tamed of mankind."

Animals can sense when something big is about to happen. They can sense when there is a change in the

atmosphere. But human beings are not always aware of the times and even judgment that is coming. Many humans ignore these signs and times that they are living in. They find themselves at the judgment at the end of their life because they did not heed the warnings. Psalm 104:21 says, "The young lions roar after their prey, and seek their meat from God.

For the righteous man that has animals takes good care of them and makes sure that their needs are met. The righteous man does not treat his animals wickedly or unfairly. He treats them with respect. The wicked are not so. The wicked are cruel to animals. The wicked do not have mercy for their animals. Proverbs 12:10 says, "A righteous man regardeth the life of his beast: but the tender mercies of the wicked are cruel."
