high school and college. When I went to college, I had the right to be able to get a Pell Grant which paid for my schooling as well as my books and supplies. Also, there are also a couple of laundry rooms for residents to do their own laundry. That is a blessing for all the residents and for myself too.

I also receive food stamps, which are governmental food assistance that helps pay for groceries. I have a food card that gets loaded every month with between \$200 and \$300, and that is enough for just me living in this apartment alone by myself. So I am very blessed and fortunate to have these resources. I know that God will still provide for me even if I did not have this food card or the resources at hand. He always makes a way. Other countries do not have governmental benefits, and in fact, many people migrate to the USA to get governmental benefits, jobs, and education.

Other countries like Nigeria do not have the best government. Their government does not provide for them these benefits that the USA does. The country of Nigeria is going through a famine right now and is without food at times. So other countries are less fortunate than we are in America. We are very blessed and wealthy to live in America. We take so much for granted in the USA.
